Keynote Speaker:

Dr. Ari Pollack is a pediatric nephrologist at Seattle Children's and a principal investigator in the Center for Clinical and Translational Research at Seattle Children's Research Institute.

His commitment to improving healthcare records led him to informatics, specializing in ambulatory computerized provider order entry, health information exchange, and electronic health record design.

Dr. Pollack's research endeavors center around using human-centered design and human-computer



interaction principles to support healthcare decision-making and improve patient outcomes. As a principal investigator, he leads innovative initiatives within the <u>Health</u> <u>Information and Visualization Experience</u> (HIVE) Lab, where tools and technology are developed to streamline patient records and facilitate collaborative decision-making while tailoring care to patients' values. His recently completed K-award focused on combining technology and clinical outcomes with patient-developed photographic imagery to illustrate their kidney transplant journey – linking past, present, and future.

Dr. Pollack participates in the Improving Renal Outcomes Collaborative (IROC) learning health network as a member and past chair of the Quality Improvement/Information Technology (QI/IT) Committee. His work at Seattle Children's, the University of Washington, and IROC has a tremendous positive impact on the lives of young patients and their families.
